Hello all,

February is well underway already. We had another great Australia Day. Thanks to all helped in anyway. Bevin did a great job again and thankfully It wasn't quite as hot as 2005. Looking forward to sigh on day on the 25th February can I ask for some baking for morning tea? This would be a great help girls! I have a recipe for some bread which is very nice with soup (Won't be long before the cooler months are with us– The way time flies.)

Blue Cheese and Walnut Damper

2 1/2 cups S/R flour	155g Chopped walnuts
250g crumbled blue cheese	1 cup buttermilk or milk
1 tbsp snipped fresh chives	1 tbsp vegetable oil
1 tsp paprika	60g grated parmesan cheese

1. Place flour, cheese, chives, paprika and 125 g of walnuts in a bowl and mix to combine.
2. Make a well in the centre of the flour mix and add the milk and oil. Mix to form a soft dough.
3. Turn dough onto a lightly floured surface and knead until smooth. Roll into a large ball, flatten slightly and place on a lightly greased baking tray. Sprinkle with parmesan cheese and remaining walnuts and bake for 40 mins or until damper is cooked. Oven temps 180c, 350f Gas 4.

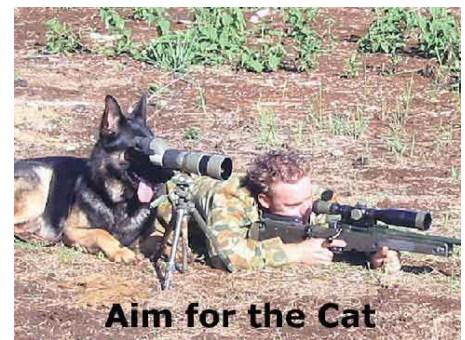
